
ICC Commission Guidelines for arbitrating small claims (2003)




ICC Expedited Procedures (2017)






SCOPE OF APPLICATION

CONSTITUTION OF THE ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL


The Court may appoint a sole arbitrator, notwithstanding any contrary provision of the arbitration agreement.

The Court's will normally appoint a sole arbitrator.

may appoint three arbitrators if appropriate in the circumstances and taking into consideration rules of law that may be applicable.

If the Court decides that the EPP no longer apply it can reconstitute the arbitral tribunal if appropriate.

PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE TRIBUNAL




SCALES AND COSTS

Arbitrators fees are 20% lower under the Expedited Procedure Scales

The advance on costs will be fixed under the Expedited Procedure Scales after the parties have been informed that the EPP apply.

The advance on costs may be readjusted on the basis of the general scales if the Court decides that the EPP no longer apply.
