DUE PROCESS PARANOIA

1. due process

- no uniform definition of due process
- generally accepted elements
 - fair and impartial treatment of the parties
 - opportunity for a party to present its case
 - opportunity to deal with the case of the opponent
 - no surprise decision
- intended as a shield to protect the parties
- often (mis)used as a sword to undermine efficiency
 - repeated requests for extension of deadlines
 - belated new claims, arguments or evidence

2. due process paranoia

- tribunal grants unjustified requests out of excessive caution
 - fear that the award may be successfully challenged
 - fear that the award may not be enforced
 - liability of the arbitrator
- due process paranoia can result in
 - prolongation of the proceedings
 - additional costs for parties
 - frustration of arbitration users
- due process paranoia hurts arbitration
- no reason for due process paranoia (in most jurisdictions)

3. overestimated risk of negative consequence

- great reluctance to set aside arbitral awards
 - high bar for due process-violation
 - 1 out of 112 due process-challenges successful in England and Wales
 - 7% of challenges successful in Switzerland
- modern arbitration rules support arbitrators to be decisive
- modern arbitration rules promote / require efficiency
 - art 17.1 UNCITRAL Rules
 - artt 22.1 and 22.4 ICC Rules
 - artt 28.1 and 28.2 Vienna Rules
- duty to immediately object to perceived violation of due process

4. underestimated risk of reputation loss

- wanted procedural qualities in an arbitrator (2019 survey)
 - issuing an award within a reasonable period of time (70%)
 - being willing to make difficult decisions on procedural issues (68%)
 - possessing case and counsel management skills (68%)
- qualities that an arbitrator should therefore not have
 - laissez faire attitude to proceedings
 - weak in decisions
 - excessive caution / timidity / due process paranoia
- reputation damage resulting therefrom often underestimated
